MISSION

Involving ourselves with people, who are marginalized, exploited and oppressed by ensuring their dignity and self worth as families and communities.



In Salem our call is to serve and uplift the families by working mainly with women and children who live in conditions such as poverty, illiteracy, bonded labour, child labour, child abuse, child marriage, immorality, etc. Chennai Society is not only our main source of finance but it is a great support and encouragement to us in serving our poor and the deserving.

Through Chalice, we carry out our activities in 17 villages of Ayodhiyapattanam block, Salem District, Tamil Nadu.

Our activities include education of children, eradication of Child Labor and empowerment of Women and Children.

Visiting of the Villages:-

We go to the villages daily to visit the families, listen to them, help when needed, encourage the parents to send their children to school and coaching classes regularly on time and take care of their health.

They are also motivated to save some money for the future so that they can avoid depending on the money lenders.

Awarness on Nurtrition

About 500 Children are helped daily through the 15 Evening Coaching Centres in different villages.

Inorder to prepare our children for their future, we have regular monthly meetings based on Value Education for them and their Parents in different areas.

Counseling is also given when needed. Children are encouraged to save whenever they get money from their parents and relatives.

During the year they are given training in various aspects, like leadership, carrier guidance, Yoga, Nutritious food and Health and Hygiene.

Health care is provided through medical camps and follow up treatment for children and their families.

Deserving cases are also given financial assistance for treatment. Exposure trips are arranged for women, and children to like-minded organizations to widen their outlook

Sponsorship programme

From the beginning of this Academic year 177 children are receiving sponsorship from CHALICE Project towards Education, health, clothing, family/community needs, etc.

From June 2014, the Sponsorship funds are transferred directly to the beneficiary's a/c.

The Amount thus transferred, is determined by the Site with the approval of the main Chalice Office.

Chalice Direct Family Fund aims at establishing and supporting better caring relationship.

The networking of small groups called Chalice Circles consist of sponsored families.

The DFF facilitates the members to be self-regulated and responsible.

Skill training in Tailoring



The Needle - Work Centre for Girls, at the Good Shepherd Convent Salem, caters for Girls especially school dropouts and others from low income groups.

During this year 48 young girls and women have learnt tailoring and have equipped themselves for alternative income. We have given Tailoring machines to two deserving students. They are also given value based classes in health and hygiene.

SKILLS @ CHALICE Skills @ Chalice was initiated in The beginning of this Academic year June 2014.

It aims at the development of young girls by providing them with Training in Tailoring. Due to lack of funds we had to join the Skills @ Chalice to give free training in tailoring for three months providing them with certificates. As this programme provides job opportunities for young girls, we motivate them to develop their skills and become self-reliant by earning their livelihood. We encourage them to be successful through their hard work and determination.on.







Women and Youth development programme

We organize classes on Value Education and Counsellingprogrammes to come out of their fears and worries with selfconfidence.



Prison Ministry

We are one of the Active Members of the Prison Ministry of India (PMI). Over the years one of us visits the Central Jail in Salem every week and conducts awareness classes and counsels them.

It is heartening to note that our Salem Bishop Rt.Rev.Dr. S.Singarayan shows keen interest in the welfare of the Prisoners and visits them every year when we have the Christmas programme there.

Once a yearOur Community also goes with the Sister for the Christmas programme. We also invite the students of the Cluny High School to entertain the Prisoners with Cultural items which the Prisoners look forward to and enjoy. Of late, we have also arranged for a Mass to be celebrated there once a month for the Catholic Prisoners. The MSFS Fathers from JyothiDarshan very kindly come to celebrate this Mass in spite of their various commitments, for which we are very grateful.
