A TEARFUL ADIEU TO OUR LOVING SR. ZITA OLIVEIRA

This is my beloved daughter in whom I am well pleased, these words of God the father consoles us as we gather here to bid farewell to our beloved Sr. Zita Oliveira.

Sr. Zita was born to pious and devoted parents Joao and Angelina Oliveira on 8th November, 1973 in Goa. Her birth brought prosperity to her



family. She has 3 elder sisters and 3 elder brothers. She lost her father a few years ago and her aged mother is living. Being the youngest in the family she is very much loved by everyone and they consider her as a precious jewel in the family. She was brought up by her grandparents while her parents were in the fishing business. She was a good football player and her family wanted her to get into some business but she chose to serve the poor.

She joined the Sisters of the Good Shepherd after her 12th and underwent all the formation in Bangalore. She made her first commitment on 30th June, 1998 in Bangalore and Perpetual Commitment in Goa on 21st May, 2004. She did her BSW in Mumbai and MSW in Nagpur. She has done a one-year diploma in theology, youth ministry and faith formation in Christu Jyothi College, Bangalore. She rendered her service in various communities - Karjat, Balaghat, Nagpur, Virar she was in charge of the Chalice sponsorship programme and was also helping out in social development projects. She worked as a project field work co-ordinator in Goa for 2 years in the Anti Human trafficking project in collaboration with Caritas India. She served as a Warden for the children of women in prostitution for 2 years in Virar. Presently she was in charge of the Rose Bakery in Garatola, Madhya Pradesh for the past 4 years empowering the tribal girls to be self-sustainable by giving them training on bakery products.

Sr. Zita is well known for her commitment and dedication to the responsibility entrusted to her. She has special love for the poor especially towards the children, women and youth. She is a compassionate woman.

Her heart moves to respond to anyone in struggle and she gives herself fully to alleviate their sufferings. She is very simple in her approach, her cheerful and caring attitude made everyone happy in her company. She is hardworking even sacrificing her time and energy for the sake of the mission. She is sincere, accountable and transparent. We can never forget the sweet memories of her presence with us.

In the 2nd week of April Sr. Zita was down with fever and diagnosed as Typhoid and was taking treatment for the same but did not show any improvement and was brought to Nagpur on 20th night and on 21st she was taken to Alexis super speciality hospital in Nagpur. Doctors at the emergency diagnosed her positive for Covid-19 and her oxygen level was going down and the CT scan report showed that her lungs were fully infected and the condition was very critical. They were not willing to admit her but with our persuasion she got admission in the ICU with a ventilator and they gave all the possible treatment for 9 days but could not save her. She breathed her last on 29th April 2021 at 9.45 pm in the hospital.

Dear Zita, your passing away has created a void in our hearts
